This is your Application Form to attend the Central North Island Region Summer Camp from 3-9 January 2015 for Scouts and 10-14 January 2015 for Cubs.

THE CAMP SITE

The Central North Island Region Summer Camp uses the Waitawheta Camp site at 439 Waitawheta Road, RD2, Waihi which is situated in a farming community 10kms from Waihi and 16kms from Paeroa. Scout Troops and Cub Packs will camp on a farm paddock adjoining the property.

CAMP PREREQUISITIES

- ALL individuals must be able to and be capable of camping with their Troop or Pack. Leaders and Adult Helpers must be able to participate in all activities.
- Youth must be a member of a Group/Troop/Pack as at 31 December 2014 and must be prepared to accept the rules and regulations of the CNI Region Summer Camp. A Troop may bring up to one non-scout age youth to camp per patrol with the approval of the Troop Leader at camp.

HOW TO APPLY

An Application Form is attached. Please read the information carefully before filling out the Application. Complete your application and forward to your Troop or Pack Leader. The Zone Section Leader or Group Leader will forward all applications/deposits as a Troop or Pack collectively to the **CNI Regional Service Centre NO LATER than Friday 12 September 2014.**

Answer all questions, illegible handwriting, incomplete or unsigned forms will be deemed void and if necessary returned to the applicant. There is a one person one form policy.

THE COST

Contact your Troop or Pack Leader for full camp costs as it varies due to travel and other associated costs commonly referred to as a contingent fee.

1. A non-refundable deposit of \$50.00 must be included with the Application Form.
2. The balance of the fee must be received **NO LATER than Thursday 30 October 2014.**

Costs cover meals, accommodation and programme.

ACTIVITIES

SCOUTS – there is a new Scout programme that includes, tramps, canoe expeditions, shooting, mountain biking and cycle expeditions (bring your own bike), rafting, and swimming. Scouts see the attached Activities Pre-Selection Sheet for more information.

CUBS - the Cub Programme is similar to previous camps with the addition of one or two even more exciting and challenging activities. There will be three major bases, each including three sub bases. Packs will rotate through each base during the three programme days.

N.B. All Leaders will be needed to help with activities.

TROOP & PACK ORGANISATION

First in first served – there are nine possible Troop or Pack sites (Jamboree size). We reserve the right to put two small Troops or Packs on one site if needed. They may be fully independent, or collaborate and use one kitchen if they choose. Zone Troops and Packs, or individual Troops and Packs may book a site. The Zone Section Leader or Group Leader appoints the Troop or Pack Leader.

SCOUT SECTION - the ratio of adults, one of which must be a Warranted Leader, to Scouts must be no less than one per two Patrols of 5 to 8 plus one fulfilling the role of Supervising Cook and one as the Troop Leader.

CUB SECTION - the ratio of adults, one of which must be a Warranted Leader, to Cubs must be no less than 1-6 plus one fulfilling the role of Cook, and one as the Pack Leader.

Non Warranted Personnel must also supply a signed Duty of Care Document with their application form and deposit.

NON SCOUTS

A limited number of non-Scout youth will be accepted for the Scout Camp. This is subject to Troops being prepared to host them (*It could be a good way to recruit new Scouts*). The camp will refund \$50 of the fee if any non-Scouts attending subsequently join Scouts.

FINAL DETAILS

Will be posted to your Troop or Pack Organiser in October.

ARRIVAL & DEPARTURE

LIMITED PARKING AT THE DROP OFF POINT

Too help manage traffic on a narrow and busy road we request that arrivals be managed as follows:

1. Eastern Waikato groups arrive about 10.00am
2. Waikato groups arrive about 10.30am
3. Western Bay of Plenty groups arrive about 11.00am
4. Auckland groups and others arrive about 11.30am

It's not critical if you are early or late but to aim for these times would be really helpful in creating a safe drop off point.

SCOUT PROGRAMME

Use **Tab** key to move forward or **Shift + Tab** to move backward between fields on form.

There are ten (10) half day bases available; each Troop can expect to visit eight (8) during the camp.

The ten (10) activities are:

- Abseiling
- Pioneering fun
- Tramping (half day)
- Canoeing
- Shooting/archery
- Survival techniques
- Service to the community
- Geo Caching / Craft work
- BMX
- Fire building/cooking

Scouts will also be able to choose to take part in **ONE** of 4 expeditions of either one or two nights each.

Older Scouts should take part in a two (2) night expedition while younger Scouts take part in a one (1) night expedition.

The expeditions are:

- Tramping
- Mountain biking
- Canoeing
- Survival

Troops/Scouts will be able to apply for a place on an expedition online from August onwards. Scouts and Leaders will need to supply their own road worthy bike if choosing that option.

Scout programmes will include a campfire, a Scouts Own, fun and games on the Village Green.

CUB PROGRAMME

There will be three major activity bases, each includes three sub activity bases all based around a fun filled exciting theme that includes some of the requirements from the four programme Cornerstones of the Cub Award Scheme. Packs will rotate through each major base during the three programme full days on each base, having meals on the bases.

Major Base	Activities will include
Fire/Ice	Fire making, fire safety, map reading, compass work, treasure (food) hunting, tracking, food preparation and cooking and working with dry ice and ice-lollies as well as campfire.
Earth/Wind	Civil Defence Preparedness, rock-climbing, abseiling, woggle making, wind-orientated fun, flying fox, campcraft, handcraft, outdoor code and First Aid.
Water	Rafting, kayaking, swimming, tubing, nature conservation, eel trapping, aquascope building, water safety, water purification and nature trails.

After the days base activities there may be displays from *(subject to availability at the time due to the nature of their work)*

- St Johns Ambulance, Waihi
- Volunteer Fire Unit, Paeroa
- NZ Police, Waihi

On the last evening there will be a skit/talent show for all to share in the fun and humour.

Cub programmes will include a campfire, a Cubs Own, fun and games on the Village Green.
